Heywood Rural Health Receives Emergency Crash Cart - 2 minute read

Heywood Rural Health Medical Clinic have sourced a new "crash cart" to be used to transport medical equipment within the Medical Practice.

The crash cart houses essential equipment, such as a Defibrillator and ECG machine, within the Medical Clinic.

Jacki Barnett Community Health Hub manager said the safety and wellbeing of our community is paramount.

"The new crash cart replaces a dated version, is easy to maneuver and includes an IV pole", said Ms Barnett.

"The crash cart funded by United Way Glenelg enables medical services to be provided with increased efficiency."

Heywood Rural Health is a multidisciplinary clinic that has two GPs, Dr Samsun Nahar and Dr Erin Gordon, Practice Nurses, District Nursing Services and a complement of Allied Health services, including Dietetics, Diabetes Educators, Occupational Therapy Physiotherapy and Podiatry.

The purchase of the crash cart is funded through United Way Glenelg Community Fund.
